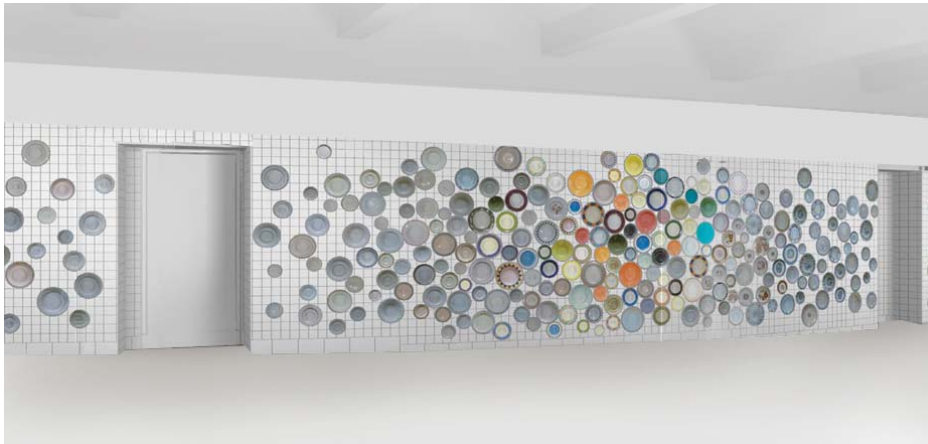


DONATE A PLATE TO PUBLIC ART

Members of the Battery Park City Community are invited to participate in a public art project that will be permanently installed in the cafeteria of the new PS/IS 276 building as part of New York City's Percent for Art program in the summer of 2010. Jean Shin's *Settings* is a site-specific installation comprised of ceramic plates donated from the residents and businesses of Battery Park City, and it reflects the identities of the community who will attend and support the life of the school.

Be a part of this unique opportunity to contribute a household plate to the art making process that will result in permanent, public art in a Battery Park City public school.

Please use the following guidelines:

- Select **ONE Round or Oval-shaped plate or saucer** that best represents you and your family
- Ceramic can have normal wear and tear, however it **should NOT be chipped, cracked or broken**
- Make sure the plate is made of china, ceramic, earthenware—**NO metal, plastic or paper**
- Plates **CANNOT** be more than 2 inches in depth—**NO deep bowls or cups**
- A **range** of plate sizes is ideal, from small saucers to oversized plates
- Clearly write your Full Name on the **back** of your plate in **permanent marker**
- Sign and fill out the **donation form** and attach securely to your plate
